Are you about to become a mother or father or has your child recently been born?

Congratulations – we wish you all the best and your child a good start in life.

The (upcoming) birth of your child brings many changes to your everyday life. If you are soon to become a mother or father, then you have to make sure you have put several things in order and are prepared: Find a midwife, go to a childbirth preparation course, have the acknowledgment of paternity certified, inform the health insurance company, apply for parental leave...

If your child has already been born, there are a number of tasks which you must do, such as visiting the citizens' registration office, attending preventive medical check-ups, taking care of child benefit and parental allowance, organising a place in a day care centre and much more.

The roadmap "What do you need to know around the time of birth?" compiles the things you should consider during pregnancy and after the birth of your child, and what things need to be done.

You will also find out when and where you can apply for financial and material assistance and which documents you need for this.

We would like to be at your side during this time and can provide services for families around the birth and with children up to the age of 3. These are called **EARLY ASSISTANCE** programmes.

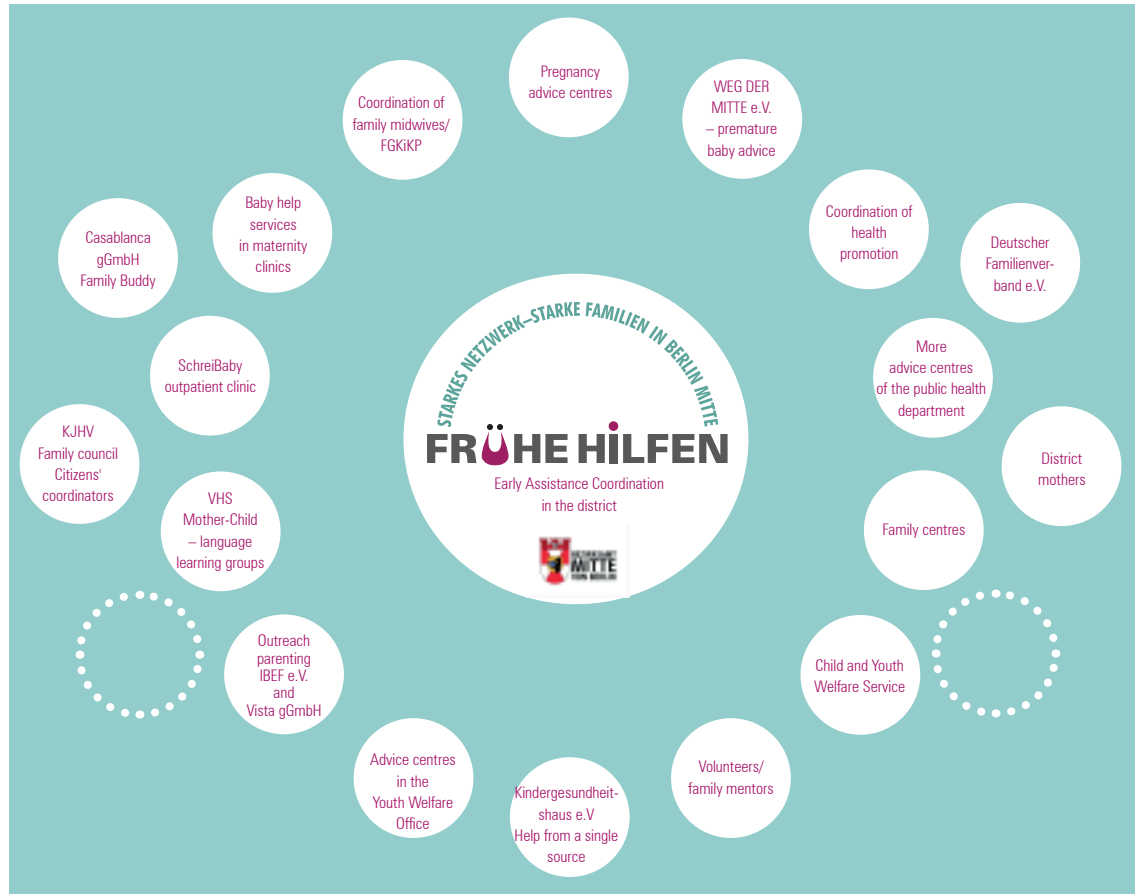

Faamily Service Office – The best for your family

The Family Service Office provides free advice on various topics:

nurseries, after-school care and childcare

- Information and details about the day care voucher and after-school care
- Acceptance of day care centre applications and documents

Maintenance advance

For single parents, the maintenance advance fund steps in if the other parent does not or cannot provide sufficiently for the child. In this case, your child will be paid an advance by the state.

- Initial advice on maintenance advance payments
- Acceptance of maintenance advance applications and documents

Parental allowance

Parental allowance is paid to all parents who look after their child themselves after the birth and take a career break or work a maximum of 32 hours a week.

- Information on parental allowance (detailed advice is given at the parental allowance office)
- Acceptance of parental allowance applications and documents

● ARE YOUR NERVES ON EDGE? – NEVER SHAKE YOUR BABY!

Why shaking is so dangerous...

If parents lose control of themselves for a few seconds and shake their baby, they can harm them for life. Babies cannot yet hold their head on their own. When being shaken, the head is thrown back and forth. This can cause serious injuries to the brain. This is called a shaken baby syndrome. Blood vessels and nerve pathways tear which can lead to seizures as well as mental and physical disabilities. Between 10 and 30 percent of the children may even die.

Also inform grandparents, neighbours and babysitters about the danger of shaking.

Should you lose your control:

Take your child to the nearest clinic immediately!

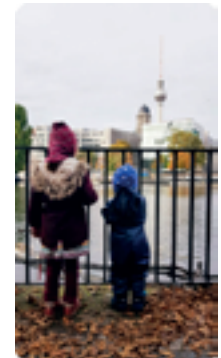
