By the way: The name *Neukölln* refers both to the district and its northern part. Together with four other localities – *Britz*, *Buckow*, *Gropiusstadt* and *Rudow* – it makes up the administrative district of Neukölln. While size-wise it is the third-smallest district in Berlin, its 300,000 inhabitants make it one of the most populous ones.

Discover urban life, idyllic village centres and impressive buildings, green urban oases and colourful art, charming markets and exciting places for families. In short: Experience the most beautiful sights of this diverse district.

The *Neuköllner Oper* is Berlin's fourth opera house. It stages eight to ten premieres per year, featuring a wide and exciting array of genres: Opera, operetta, musicals and other performances. Its auditorium offers seats for up to 220 spectators, while the smaller studio stage caters to an audience of up to 60 people.




### Passage Kino



### **Schloss Britz: Back to the Gründerzeit**

Neukölln can do laid-back and urban chic. It can also do elegance and style. Case in point: *Schloss Britz*, part of a spacious estate. This 300-year-old Prussian manor house is situated in an almost two-hectare park. It was erected on the site of the *Rittergut*, a historic feudal estate in the former village of Britz. Absolutely worth seeing: The carefully refurbished rooms with their *Gründerzeit* flair from the Wilhelminian era. Art enthusiasts can look forward to exhibitions showcasing international artwork and classical concerts, and gourmets can savour regional culinary specialties. *Schloss Britz* has been a listed historical site since 1971.

### **Gutshof Britz: A Cowshed full of Culture**

Other buildings on this estate are also in use again: The old cowshed hosts cultural events. The historic horse stables house *Museum Neukölln*. The *Musikschule Paul Hindemith Neukölln* rehearses in the former estate manager's house. In addition, there is an open-air stage and – especially cool for kids – the opportunity to watch cows, bunnies and horses at USE, a social initiative for animal welfare.

### ***Rixdorfer Schmiede: Forging the hot iron***

Right on the central square in Rixdorf, the former village green now called Richardplatz, is the old *Rixdorfer Schmiede* smithy. With first references dating back to 1624, it is the oldest smithy still in use in Berlin. Goldsmith's jewellery, knives and a wide variety of artisanal objects are manufactured here. At various events and during the Christmas Market, visitors have the opportunity to watch metals being forged. For those wanting to wield the hammer themselves, the smithy also offers courses. It is even possible to forge personalized wedding rings.





### ***Böhmisches Dorf: Pure village charm***

Ready to do some time traveling? Then visit the *Böhmisches Dorf*. Bohemian refugees founded this small community in 1737. Thanks to old streetlights, cobblestone pavements and picturesque houses with their lush front yards, it feels like a short trip back in time to the 18th century. You can discover sites such as the *Comenius-Garten*, the *Museum im Böhmischen Dorf* and the well-preserved *Bethlehemskirche* church from the 15th century on a walk through the former village.

# Art everywhere

Neukölln's art scene is vibrant, diverse and always a bit different. Open studios and art spaces offer creative people from around the world the perfect setting to express themselves artistically. Numerous small galleries exhibit the works of international and local artists. The *KINDL-Zentrum* presents contemporary art in all its shapes and colours – alongside the art of brewing.

*Museum Neukölln* is the second oldest museum for local history after the *Märkisches Museum* – and one of the most distinguished ones. Designed as an interactive exhibition, it allows visitors to immerse themselves in the eventful history and urban culture of Neukölln.

## KINDL – Centre for Contemporary Art

### Art is brewing

It's always possible to argue about art – especially contemporary art. And particularly when this art is spread throughout the *KINDL – Zentrum für zeitgenössische Kunst* on three floors with an exhibition space of more than 1,600 square metres. Since 2016, this very spacious compound in the former Kindl brewery has been offering the perfect setting for international contemporary art. Several times a year numerous large exhibitions are presented in this striking industrial monument, built in the 1920s style of Brick Expressionism.



The exhibitions are supplemented by artist talks, lectures and concerts. The 20m-high boiler house is absolutely stunning. This exhibition space features artworks specifically designed for this setting. Another eye-catching feature: the former brew house with its six gigantic copper vats. At one point in time they were the largest brewing vats in Europe. Today, one can savour coffee and cake here at *Café Kosmetiksalon Babette*.



## A curvy World Heritage Site

### Socially-minded from the start

Those able to fly have a clear advantage. They can immediately see why this housing estate was named the *Hufeisensiedlung*: From above, the curved shape of the residential complex is clearly reminiscent of a horseshoe. As one of the first social housing projects in the world, it is an important example of New Objectivity architecture. The housing complex was built between 1925 and 1930 at the site of the former *Rittergut Britz* feudal estate. It was planned by Bruno Taut and Martin Wagner. They wanted to create affordable living spaces for workers – not cheap and shabby tenements, but well-equipped, pleasant and bright apartments instead.

### Urban Development at its Most Beautiful

Today the whole ensemble of buildings includes around 1,300 apartments and 679 terraced houses. Numerous gardens, lawns and even a small pond can be found inside this residential area. Since 2008, the *Hufeisensiedlung* has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site – and rightly so. The functional and modest design was groundbreaking for residential architecture in the 1920s and 1930s. Its style became characteristic of a new approach to urban development.

### Jungfernmühle

The wooden beams of Berlin's oldest windmill have carried their weight for 300 years. They can be aptly found in the *Holländisches Viertel* (Dutch Quarter) close to *Gropiusstadt*. The *Wiesenstein Speisemeisterei*, a cosy restaurant, resides in its restored interior.

This village church with its grey fieldstones harks back to a distant time. Constructed sometime between 1230 and 1250, visitors can admire its religious art, such as the figures of the patron saint of Buckow, two altar wings and carved saints.

**U-Bahnhof Hermannstraße**

This bike ride starts at *U-Bahnhof Hermannstraße*. There's always a lot of hustle and bustle at this transfer station where an underground and city train line meet.

**Koppelweg**

The tour continues on a green area, which runs alongside the Autobahn tunnel. Crossing the *Teltowkanal* one can see an ensemble of bridges. One of these is the high bridge called *Gottlieb-Dunkel-Brücke*.

61

**Trail next to the train tracks**

After riding through a spacious area of allotment gardens you'll finally arrive at some train tracks. These belong to the former Neukölln-Mittenwald train line. The tour continues alongside the tracks until *Gropiusstadt*.

62

**Following the Berlin Wall Trail**

Numbering close to 19,000 apartments, *Gropiusstadt* is one of the largest post-war housing estate developments in West Berlin. At this point the tour continues on the Berlin Wall Trail along the border to Brandenburg.

63

**Dörferblick near Großziethen**

From here on it's all uphill. At its southernmost corner, the trail leads up to the top of one of the highest hills in Berlin, the *Dörferblick*.

64

**Water buffalo meadow**

After a little bit more effort it's time to observe some wildlife! Just a few kilometres further on, water buffalos graze in the *Landschaftspark Rudow-Altglienicke*.

65

**Berlin Wall Memorial**

A Berlin Wall memorial awaits just around the corner from the Rudower Höhe hill. It's a segment of the *Hinterlandsicherungsmauer* (hinterland security wall), dating back to the construction of the wall by the GDR.

66

**Ost-Krone**

Following the *Ost-Krone*, a six-kilometre-long paved inline skating track, the ride continues along the banks of the *Teltowkanal*. The track is wide enough to cycle along swiftly without any risky passing manoeuvres.

67

**Teltowkanal**

The *Teltowkanalweg* is one of the 20 major green hiking trails through the city. Cycling along the small canal leads back to Neukölln.

## Flower Power

Much to the delight of West Berliners, the *Bundesgartenschau* (Federal Garden Exhibition – BUGA for short) came to the city in 1985. The locals were able to enjoy the newly laid out opulent sculpted gardens for 178 days between April and October. Subsequently it became *Britzer Garten* and over time turned into one of the most beautiful and popular recreational park areas in Berlin. With a total area of 90 hectares, it encompasses lakes, creeks and springs surrounded by extensive meadows, groves, shrub and flowerbeds as well as myriad thematic gardens designed with great care.

## Resting at the molehill

Throughout the year, workshops, festivals and concerts take place at *Britzer Garten*. Special events such as the tulip and dahlia shows are very popular. For those who would rather not discover the spacious gardens on foot, a small train guarantees a comfortable ride through the entire park. Afterwards, the *Restaurant Seeterrassen*, reminiscent of an oversized molehill, invites visitors to take a relaxing break.





### Landwehrkanal

As you know, Berlin is situated on the banks of the Spree River. But the smaller *Landwehrkanal* also offers some attractions, like stylish *Gründerzeitbauten* – houses built in the early 20th century. Pictures of these can be taken during boat tours. 


### Körnerpark

These allotment gardens border on *Britzer Garten*. No new construction is allowed there, providing long-term security for the gardens. While nothing can be built, many things can be planted, such as potatoes and cabbages.

## Britzer Mühle

A 20-metre-high Dutch figure in the middle of an orchard. This twelve-sided Dutch windmill dating from 1865 is now a listed historical monument. When a sufficiently strong wind is blowing, the millstone still grinds flour.


