



Berlin Police Delegated Officer for Antisemitism

The protection of Jewish life and culture is very important to the Berlin Police. In this respect, it is a high-priority task. As part of hate crime, antisemitic attacks on Jewish people or those considered Jewish, are always directed against the values of free, democratic and open societies. In this respect, antisemitism, as part of group-related hostility to humanity, threatens peaceful coexistence and the stability of society. The fight against antisemitism is a challenge and a task for society as a whole. The law enforcement authorities have a special responsibility because they are responsible for repressing, preventing and averting dangers.

Duties and Responsibilities

The duties and responsibilities of the Berlin Police Delegated Officer for Antisemitism are:

- Central contact person for the subject matter, both internally and externally,
- Press and public relations,
- Active networking for bundled expertise and professional exchange on police preventive and repressive measures, on causes, manifestations, effects and prosecution possibilities of antisemitism,
- Initiation and support of basic and further training in the field of antisemitism,
- Continuous awareness raising of Berlin Police staff.
