

- Participants are: international startups, corporates, accelerators, incubators, VC companies, co-working spaces etc. from Berlin and Asia.
- Project objectives: Creating mutual interest and awareness, connecting hubs,
 cooperation, professionalization.
- Project activities: Roadshows, conferences, workshops, matchmaking, infrastructure, mentoring.

The next delegation trips in 2018 are planned to India, China, and South East Asia.
