MATERNITY PROTECTION/MATERNITY PAY



The pamphlet “A guide to maternity protection” (Leitfaden zum Mutterschutz) contains detailed information on the most important aspects of maternity protection.

It explains important rules and regulations affecting your rights and obligations, your health at work during the pregnancy and breastfeeding (in particular, rules on your working hours and protections at work), protection against unfair dismissal and any maternity benefits you may be entitled to.

It also contains a checklist of the most important dates, deadlines and information.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Additional assistance and one-time support payments

From the 13th week of their pregnancy, pregnant who are able to work and need help can apply to the Job Centre or for the basic income scheme run by the Social Welfare Office (Sozialamt).

Depending on your financial situation, you may also be able to apply for one-time (pro rata) allowances for basic equipment for pregnancy and birth from either **the Job Centre or the Social Welfare Office**.

Guardianship/recognition of paternity/parental care

Are you a single parent? Having to take care of maintenance and getting your child's paternity recognised?

The Youth Welfare Office (Jugendamt) can offer you advice and support. At the Youth Welfare Office, you can apply for a free guardianship arrangement.

Unwed parents can register recognition of paternity and custody declarations with the Guardianship Department (Amtsvormundschaft) even before their child is born.

You can also get advice on disputes concerning custody/access rights.

(MALE) MIDWIVES

Every pregnant woman has a right to care from the very start of their pregnancy right up until they stop breastfeeding, in the form of both preventive care and post-partum care. Please look for a male or female midwife in **plenty of time** before you give birth.

BIRTHING COURSES

There are classes you can attend to prepare yourself for birth and the first few months with your baby, getting useful information and chatting to other parents. Health insurers covers the costs for antenatal classes for pregnant women, but partners have to pay the course fees themselves. AFTER BIRTH

The male or female midwife will look after mother and baby every day for the first ten days after the birth. After that, new parents can get a further 16 house calls or advice sessions over the phone on things like looking after and feeding your baby, help and advice with breastfeeding, monitoring uterine involution and taking care of your newborn's umbilical cord.

BREASTFEEDING

You are entitled to eight consultations (over the phone or at home) on breastfeeding, nutrition and introducing other food for at least the first year after birth, or as long as you are breastfeeding. The costs for these sessions are covered by your health insurance.

MATERNITY CLINIC

Take advantage of the information evenings at the maternity clinics to help you make a more informed decision about where you would like to give birth. As well as learning lots of useful stuff, you may also get the chance to view the delivery room. Once you have chosen a clinic, you can register to give birth there. Make sure you book your appointment as early as possible, especially if your pregnancy is high risk.

BIRTH CERTIFICATE



If your child is born in Neukölln, you will receive a birth certificate from the Neukölln Civil Registry (Standesamt Neukölln). If you live in Neukölln but give birth in a different district, you must contact the civil registry for that district.

As soon as your child's birth has been registered, you will receive three free copies of their birth certificate so that you can apply for child benefit and maternity assistance from your health insurer. These documents must be presented to the relevant body or agency as originals.

Additional copies of the birth certificate are available for a fee. Therefore, please indicate on your naming certificate how many additional copies you require. Once they receive the birth certificate, the Civil Registry will submit the information concerning the child and their parents to the registration office.

Your child will then be automatically registered with the police authorities.

HEALTH INSURANCE

If you have health insurance, contact your insurer to find out if your child can be included in your family policy. Children of parents who are insured with a state insurer can usually be insured via their parents at no additional cost.

Parents who **do not have** health insurance for their child can contact the Children and Youth Healthcare Service (Kinder- und Jugendgesundheitsdienst) for certain healthcare services.

Early screening

Early screening involves special appointments with your paediatrician which are available to children aged between 1 week and 17 years old:

- U1-U9 for children aged 6 and under
- J1 for children aged 12-14

Centre for Sexual Health and Family

Free consultations with doctors, social workers and psychologists:

- All about pregnancy
- Family planning and desire to have children
- Contraception (incl. covering costs for contraception where applicable)
- Medical services for pregnant women who are not insured

CHILDREN AND YOUTH HEALTHCARE SERVICE

Health Services Neukölln

The Children and Youth Healthcare Service (Kinder- und Jugendgesundheitsdienst/KJGD) is there for you, especially in the period before your child is born. You can receive information on all sorts of things to do with your baby, either at home or in one of the KJGD information sessions.

The KJGD works closely with physiotherapists from the Therapy Services Team. They offer advice and therapy for infants, children in day care and children of school age.

The KJGD provides a special service where they visit all families with newborns at their home and give them a welcome package. Families with small children who are new to Berlin-Neukölln will also receive a visit.

All of these services are completely free!

PARENTAL LEAVE

Parental leave is limited to a maximum of three years for each child and can be taken in three intervals. 24 unclaimed months can be taken as leave up until the child's 8th birthday. You do not usually need to obtain the consent of your employer (but please make sure there are no exceptions that apply to you beforehand!).

BENEFITS FOR PARENTS

All mothers and fathers who take care of their child personally after the birth and who take a break from work or work a maximum of 32 hours a week receive benefits (Elterngeld).

CHILD BENEFIT

Legal guardians are entitled to child benefit as long as their child lives with them. Parents who are not from Germany (or another EU country) must provide evidence of a residence permit (passport) and register with the registration office (Meldebehörde). Parents who are receiving support under the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act (Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz) will not receive child benefit. Child benefit is paid out either by your employer or by the Families Fund at the Federal Employment Agency. You must apply for the relevant agency within the first 6 months of your child's birth.

CHILD SUBSIDY

Low-income families are entitled to a so-called child subsidy, subject to fulfilling certain conditions. This is an additional payment and is intended to supplement the child benefit.

HOUSING ALLOWANCE

WOHNGELD

Persons in a low income can apply for a housing allowance - a subsidy for renters or home-owners. The amount of housing allowance a family is entitled to depends on their income, the number of dependants and how much their eligible rent is (excl. utilities). Persons receiving other benefits, such as a BAföG student loan or unemployment benefits (Bürgergeld), cannot claim housing allowance.

WOHNBERECHTIGUNGSSCHEIN (WBS)

A so-called Wohnberechtigungsschein (**WBS**) allows you to live social housing which is subsidised with public money.

RLVF-CERTIFICATE

With a so-called RlvF-Certificate, you can move into a property that is subsidised with public funds. Whether or not you need an RlvF-Certificate depends on the property you want to move into. An RlvF-Certificate is generally valid for 1 year and will be collected by the landlord when you move into the property.

ADVANCE PAYMENTS FOR SINGLE PARENTS

A so-called Unterhaltsvorschuss is a benefit provided for children of single parents. It is intended to help ensure that your child's living situation is financially stable in the event that maintenance payments are not made. In such cases, your child can be paid an advance. This advance must then be repaid by the person responsible for paying maintenance.

DAY CARE

You must get a **childcare voucher** before you can claim a place at a day care centre. You can apply for this at the Youth Welfare Office where you live. You can apply for a childcare voucher up to 9 months before you wish your child to start day care. Applications should be submitted no later than 2 months in advance.
