Mika - digital and personalized therapy support for cancer patients


Statistically, nearly every second person in Germany will be diagnosed with cancer at some point in their lives. Such a diagnosis entails significant physical and psychological challenges for affected individuals, such as depression or anxiety disorders. The digital platform "Mika" aims to alleviate these challenges and restore self-determination and quality of life to cancer patients.

app, had people in their personal circles who were diagnosed with cancer. This made the founders acutely aware of the need for psychological support, even though comprehensive psycho-oncological care is not guaranteed throughout Germany.



INDIVIDUAL AND EFFECTIVE

The digital therapy support "Mika" is already used by more than ten thousand people in Germany alone. Patients are accompanied around the clock during their illness. The program includes exercise routines, dietary recommendations, mindfulness exercises, as well as electronic patient reports that track their stress, symptoms, and side effects. Studies show that using the "Mika" app can demonstrably reduce psychological stress.

ERDF PROMOTES TECHNOLOGICAL PROGRESS

Among other fields, all content is rigourousely reviewed by experts in psychology and cancer medicine, to continuosly promote technological advancement as it proves fundamental for the Digital Health company's enconomic success. One example of digital progress is the "Recommender" function, which enables personalized support content and ensures that more than twice as many app functions are used.


