



Urban Structure

Structure Types With Predominantly Residential Use

- Late 19th-century block development with wings and rear buildings
- Late 19th-century block-edge development with few wings / rear buildings
- Late 19th-century block-edge development with major changes
- Twenties and thirties block-edge and row development
- Fifties and later row development
- Postwar high-rise development
- Urban living development of the nineties
- Low buildings with yards
- Villa development with park-like gardens
- Development with yards and semi-private greening
- Village-like development

Structure Types with Predominantly Commercial, Service Use, Small Business and Industrial Use

- Development with predominantly commercial and service use
- Low development with predominantly small business and industrial use
- Heavily built-up with predominantly small business and industrial use

Structure Types with Special Use

- Development with predominantly public facilities and special use, traffic areas without streets
- Not or only few built-up areas of public facilities and special use, green and open spaces
- Water

1. This presentation is focused on the different structure types in predominantly residential areas. They are defined by their structure of development and open spaces. The other structure types are determined by their use.

The other structure types are determined by their use. A more differentiated presentation can be seen on the Environmental Atlas Maps 06.01 and 06.08 "Urban Structure - differentiated".

2. The structure types were defined by 52 area types stored in the Berlin Urban and Environmental Information System.

3. Based on the map 06.07 from 2008 and database from 2005, an update was made with the aid of the below specified database. The use for 5010 and the geometrical subdivisions for 1981 areas were updated to the status of 2010-12-31.
